I.	Each Party shall, by their words, policies, and actions, respect and honor the independence and sovereignty of the mutual Parties to this treaty. Parties shall formally maintain the sovereignty and independence of both states, in perpetuity, until the disestablishment of one or all Parties.			
II.	The sovereignty and independence of each Party shall not be infringed by word, policy, or action. No action shall be undertaken to prepare war or to otherwise disturb the peaceful relations between Parties to this treaty.			
III.	Parties are encouraged to engage in trade, economic cooperation, and cultural exchange as possible and beneficial. Citizens of each Party may engage in free travel through the national borders of the Parties.			
IV.	As possible and beneficial, Parties will engage in formal diplomacy through meetings of Heads of State, exchange of ambassadors, and cultural exchange.			
V.	As enabled by the policies and laws of each nation, Parties shall permit plural citizenship between nations; unless prohibited by a nation's dictates.
